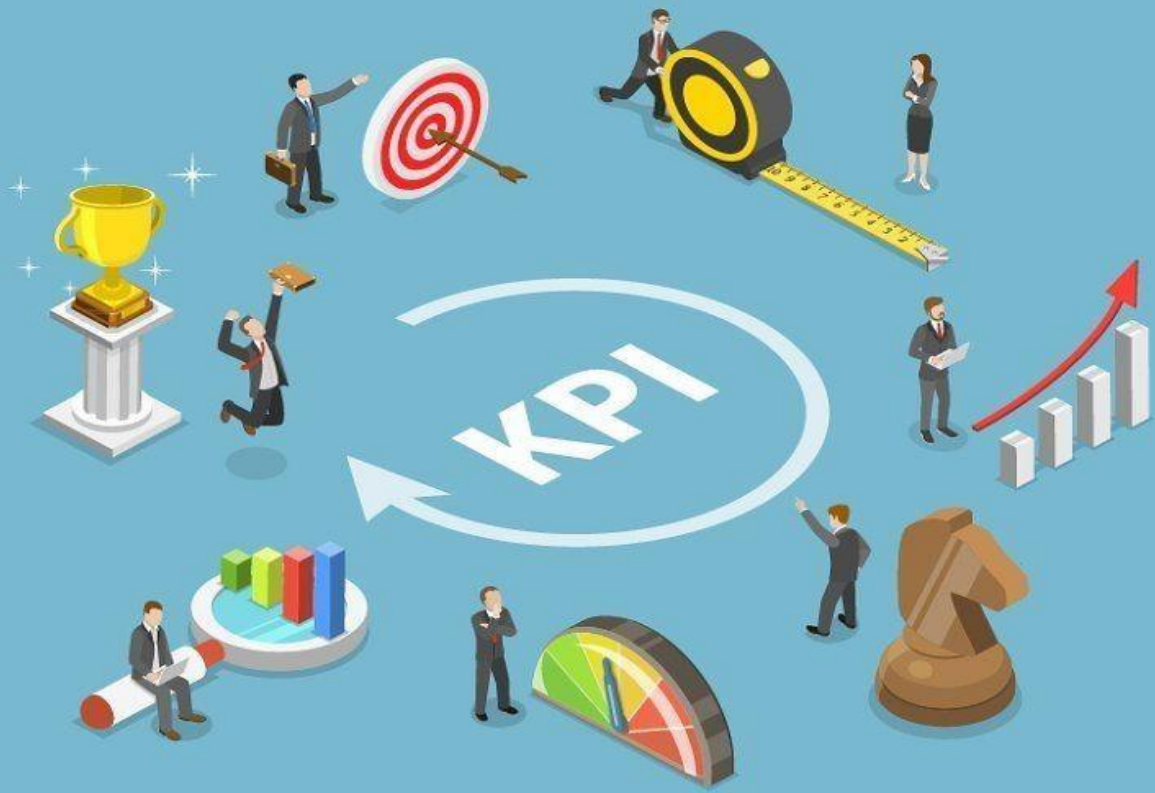

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT:

In Afghanistan youth aged **12-25** are estimated to make up **36%** of the population. This dependency ration is amongst the highest in the world, and deepens on the economic and social challenges which our country faces. **SWSO** with support of **CARITAS/COFFA** during Taliban regime in **1998-1999** conducted education for male and female in Districts **4, 9, 11** and **12** in **Kabul** city. The session covers from **30** to **60** female and more than **200** male students which are inclusion of primary to secondary schools, in the impact of implemented education project, the significant number of female students could have compensated their education gaps through passing the capability exams.

Vocational Training Key Fact on Women:

- About **510** female participated and successfully completed sowing and embroidery courses and at the result there was almost **30 %** of graduated females that covers **150** families and **900** members.
- During Taliban regime more than **200** females and **400** male students from different part of Kabul city found access to education.
- **10** woman institutions received technical and consultancy support on proposal and report writing issues.
- Afghanistan Women Education And Vocational Services Organization (**AWEVSO**) in one of close **SWSO** partners and continuously received **TOT** training and assistance on proposal and reporting developing support and consultancy.
- With partnership of **AWEVSO** about **20** celebrations conducted on Women Days, Women Rights , violence and HIV.

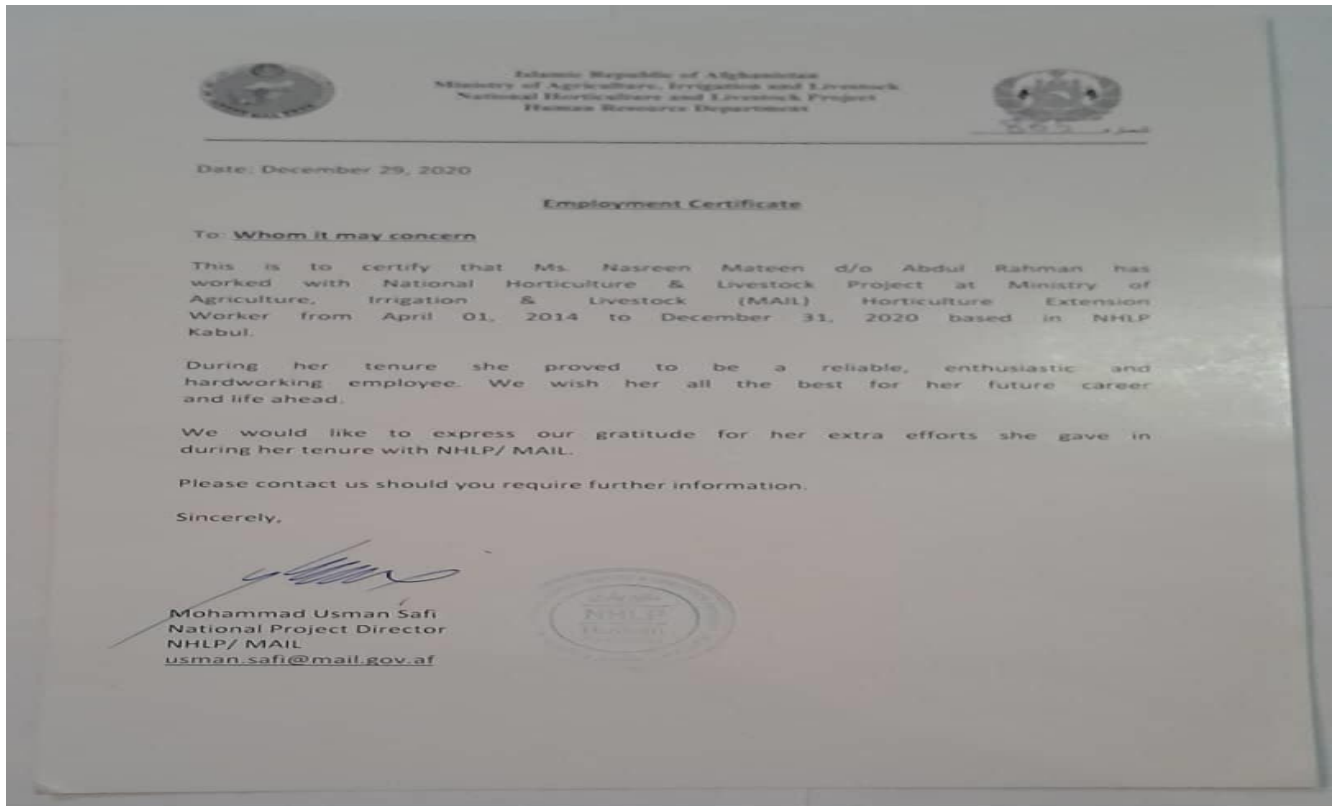

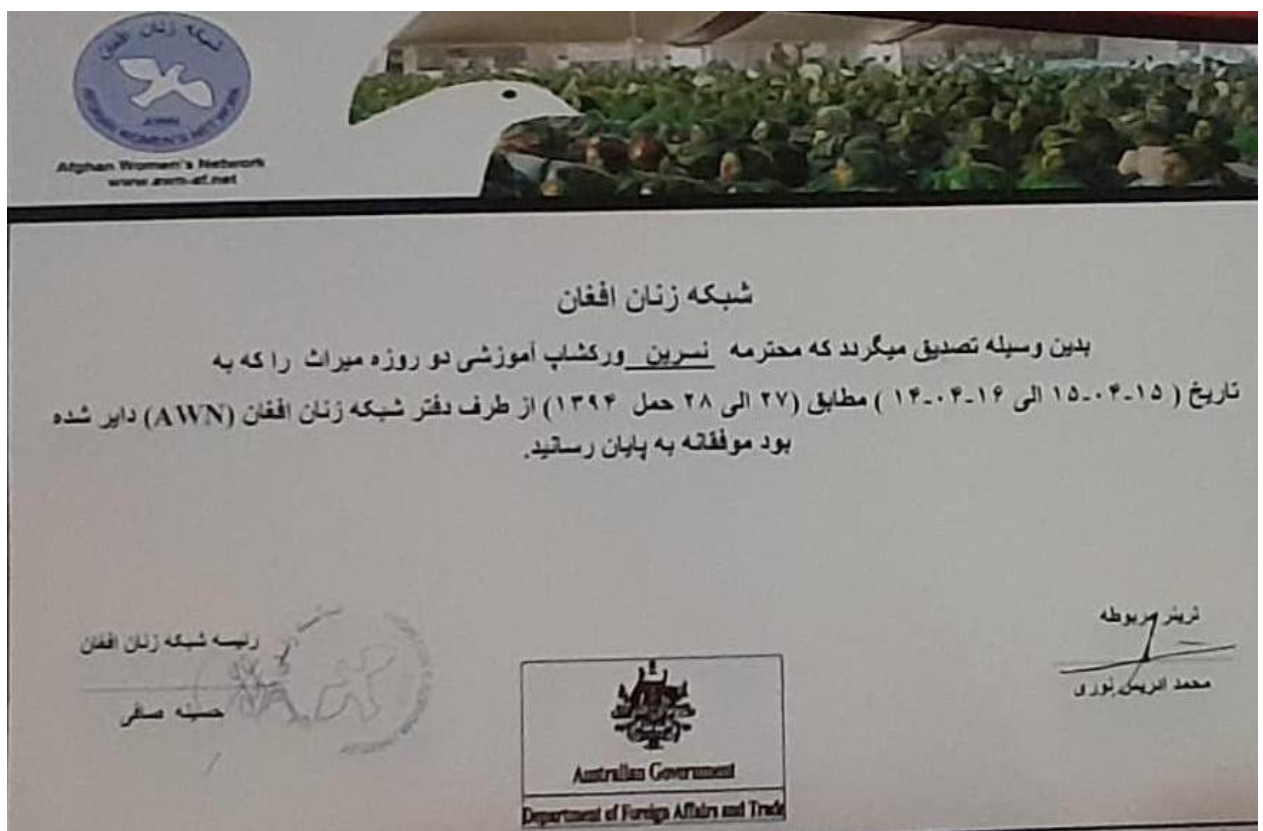
